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With an amplifier and equalization devices, a bass player can boost the low frequencies, which changes the frequency response. Jazz and rockabilly bassists develop virtuoso pizzicato techniques that enable them to play rapid solos that incorporate fast-moving triplet and sixteenth note figures. Many percussion instruments are tuned by the player, including pitched percussion instruments such as timpani and tabla and unpitched percussion instruments such as the snare drum. This is a vigorous version of pizzicato where the strings are "slapped" against the fingerboard between the main notes of the bass line, producing a snare drum-like percussive sound.
