Beyond this, it also includes several philosophers who were active in the Borders area of Scotland when Hume was living there as a young man and still in the early stages of his philosophical development. Related to this point, by widening our scope of interest in relation to Hume's views on religion, and avoiding a narrow focus on his argument concerning the existence of God, we are encouraged to consider works other than the Dialogues when assessing the nature and character of Hume's views on this subject. All we know is our profound ignorance in both cases.

Newton had been unable to explain his gravitational force in terms of a corpus. Excluding testimony in religious contexts presupposes what it would hope to prove. These are objects of human reason or inquiry; not all of them are true. Of this we are every moment conscious.
